Walkers take to Streets despite Rain, Unite to Remember Loved Ones on 9/11

More than 500 from around the Fox Valley walked to remember loved ones despite a drizzly 9/11 anniversary. It was the first suicide awareness walk held in the Valley.

"Everyone has a

walk," organizer Barb Bigalke said. "But when you say 'suicide awareness walk,' everyone changes the subject. We never anticipated in our wildest dreams that there would be a walk like there is today." The shear number of people who came to support suicide awareness on a drizzly fall day demonstrates the possibility of having future walks.

Teenagers remembered cousins and friends who ended their life too early. Mothers remembered husbands and sons. Fathers remembered daughters. One of those fathers was John Reilly, the keynote speaker for the event: "More than anything else, we need to keep sharing the light," said Reilly, whose adult daughter Amanda took her life three years ago.

But most importantly, the walk is about preventing the further loss of young loving people in our community, as Bigalke said, "I say we've all lost someone to suicide. We've lost talented, wonderful, beautiful people in our community."
